

## EASTER PAGEANT SEATING POLICY

Thank you so much for your past and continued support of the Easter Pageant. What started out as a few hundred people attending a sunrise service has grown to be the largest annual outdoor Easter Pageant in the world, with over 100,000 people attending each year. Because of the increased attendance, we have implemented a new seating policy this year that will hopefully be more accommodating for all who wish to attend.

There is no reserved seating or saving seats for the general public. However if you would like to arrive early, at least one half of your party must be present but you may not place signs on chairs or rope off a section for those coming later. At 7:45 p.m. any unoccupied seat will be released.

If members are bringing friends and neighbors not of our faith, we suggest you arrive early and obtain good seats for them. Remember that one person should be present for every two seats. Arriving early will allow you time to relax and enjoy the beauty and peacefulness of the temple grounds. We also invite you to tour of the Visitors' Center and see the new exhibit "Reflections of Christ" which was made to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the pageant. If you do leave your seats, please go in shifts so that one half of your party remains in your seating area at all times.

Again, we remind you that any signs, blankets or other items left on chairs will be removed. Unattended items will be kept in a secure location for your retrieval when you arrive.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we implement this new policy.
